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Preamble

Hidden Valley Golf Club (Wallan) Inc. (**Golf Club**) operates from the Hidden Valley Resort owned by Arcadia Group (**Hidden Valley Resort**) via a formal Access and Services Deed between the two organisations.

Members pay annual membership fees to Hidden Valley Resort to use the golf course and other resort facilities. Members in golfing categories of membership at Hidden Valley Resort automatically qualify as members of the Golf Club, subject to the discretion of the Golf Club.

Hidden Valley Resort is responsible for maintenance of the golf course, clubhouse and all facilities and services at the resort. The Golf Club oversees the annual golfing program (Syllabus) and works together with the resort team to deliver these events.

Hidden Valley Resort and the Golf Club are committed to increasing the number of golfing members, working together to provide first class facilities and services, and to make the resort and golfing experience at Hidden Valley welcoming and enjoyable.

The Ideals of Membership

The enjoyment of golf depends on a great deal of cooperation, consideration and courtesy extended by fellow Members and Players. What is also true of the game also applies to Club membership. The spirit and image of a golf club is projected by the way fellow members show respect, courtesy and consideration to one another. ***Members are asked to give close attention to:-***

- The rules of golf
- The etiquette of the game
- Speed of play

NB: YOUR POSITION IS DIRECTLY BEHIND THE GROUP IN FRONT OF YOU, NOT IN FRONT OF THE GROUP BEHIND YOU

In heeding the information contained in this syllabus, not only will you gain considerable pleasure from the time you elect to spend on the golf course and/or in the resort, but you will be adding to the pleasure and comfort of your fellow members.

"Do unto others as you would have them do unto you."

Members', guests' and visitors' house rules

- (a) **Guest Days** – The Golf Club and Hidden Valley Resort may introduce guest day events on Public Holidays and/or any other competition days, as they deem appropriate. Members may invite any players to attend on these days and play off their official Golf Australia handicap. The relevant competition fee shall be payable for the guest. Members are responsible for ensuring the behaviour of the guest is in line with that expected of members, as outlined in this handbook and syllabus.
- (b) **Visitors** – Visiting members from other golf clubs with a Golf Australia handicap, may play in the daily competition, except on days that have any golf club trophy or board events scheduled. Visiting members **must** pay the relevant green fee and golf competition fee and indicate their home club on the scorecard. Visitors are **NOT** eligible to enter the weekly jackpot pin competition.
- (c) **Personal property and Insurance** – The Golf Club shall not be liable for any loss or damage to the property of any member, guest or visitor in or on the premises.
- (d) **Car parking** – In consideration of others, members are requested to strictly observe the marked areas by parking within the marked areas.

(e) Members' responsibilities –

- i. All members must be financial before entering any club competition.
- ii. Members must book a playing tee time for all competitions directly with the Sports Hub.
- iii. Members must understand and know the conditions of play before commencing any round of golf
- iv. Members must report to the Sports Hub at least 15 minutes prior to their hit off time. Failure to do so may result in a penalty being applied, according to the rules of golf, and the particular competition being played at the time.
- v. Members must follow directions provided by the Sports Hub personnel or match committee representatives, in respect to the composition of groups and tee off times.

- (f) **Dress Regulations** – Members are reminded that they and their guests should be correctly attired on the course at all times and as per the resort's regulations. Check the resort website for more information - www.hiddenvalleyresort.com.au.

(g) Golf carts –

- i. A fee will be payable and as determined from time to time by the Facility Owner for the hire of golf carts.
- ii. Any private owner of golf carts may use these on the golf course in accordance with any rules as determined by the Facility Owner.
- iii. Carts must be driven on fairways, when not being able to be driven on any designated paths.

- iv. Blue lines are marked around greens, and as such it is required that all golf carts do not drive within these marked areas of the greens.
- v. Golf carts should not be driven within 5 metres of any bunker.
- vi. The use of golf carts on the course is the responsibility of the Facility Owner and, as such, determining their use is at the discretion of the Facility Owner. The Sports Hub staff will take into consideration the weather forecast for the day; amount of rain received in the past 24 – 72 hours; current course condition and any other factors deemed necessary and appropriate in making a decision regarding the use of the golf carts.
- vii. All directional signs, in whatever shape or form to guide and direct golf carts, must be always observed.
- viii. With regards to the use of golf carts in Golf Club competitions, please refer to the section further in this syllabus, titled Club Competitions.

Etiquette

- Players should play without delay, but should not play until the group in front is out of range.
- Players searching for a ball should call the players behind, to play through, when it becomes apparent that the ball will not easily be found (players must not spend more than 3 minutes searching for a lost ball, as per the Rules of Golf).
- To assist with the speed of play, all competitors should always look to park their carts or buggies at or towards the rear of the green and enter and exit from the back. This may mean, at times, having to take extra clubs if the ball is slightly short of or to the side of the green.
- On completion of a hole, players should leave the putting green immediately and mark their cards at the next tee. The player with the honour should play first from the next tee before marking down the scores from the previous hole.
- No one shall move, talk or stand close to, or directly behind or in front of a ball or the hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.
- A player who has incurred a penalty should advise their opponent or marker of their scorecard, when it is practicable to do so during the play of that hole.
- Players must refrain from throwing clubs and using inappropriate language at all times during play.
- Before leaving a bunker, a player should carefully repair any marks made by him/her and replace the rake in the centre of the bunker, parallel with the fairway.
- Through the green, a player should ensure that any turf, cut or displaced by him/her is replaced at once, pressed down and/or filled with sand.
- Players should ensure that when placing the flagstick in the hole, that no damage is done to the putting green and that neither they, nor their caddies damage the hole, in any shape or form. The flagstick must be replaced properly in the hole before players leave the green.
- A sand bucket MUST be carried at all times and used by all players to fill divots as and when required to do so.
- Practice is strictly prohibited on the golf course. The practice range and practice putting green must be used for practice.

- The lowest handicapped player in each group is the Captain of the group and is responsible for maintaining etiquette and course care of the group.
- Players are requested to pick up their golf ball as soon as a hole is lost in Par or a point is unable to be scored in Stableford.
- Players are not to retrieve golf balls from the hole by the use of the head of the putter as the use of the club in this way will cause unnecessary wear and tear to the holes edge and inconvenience to any following players
- Players may visit the Resort bar facilities or Sports Hub for refreshments after completing the 9th hole, however their position may be lost on the 10th tee if the players ahead are out of range and the players following are ready to use the 10th.
- Any complaints must be made in writing to the Committee for consideration and resolution. However, any questions or disagreements of the Rules of Golf or the conditions of the day can be discussed with any member of the match committee present on any given day.
- Breaches of etiquette could result in the player in question, being required to front the match committee to explain the breach, which may subsequently result in suspension from the Golf Club competitions and/or the use of the resort facilities for a period of time.
- A single player playing on the course has no standing and must give way to a match of any kind.

Club Competitions

These notes are intended to assist in the general idea of how various competitions are played and must be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf.

Eligibility for Golf Club competitions shall be open to the relevant classes of membership. Competitors taking part in a Golf Club Competition shall have priority on the golf course and other players must permit competitors to play through on request.

Only financial members are allowed to represent the Golf Club in any official events. (e.g. Pennant).

All dates and schedules of starting times for competitions shall be fixed by the Match Committee of the Golf Club and the

Match Committee reserves the right to amend both the dates and scheduled starting times, if deemed necessary.

- ***Entry into club competitions***

1. Financial members with a current handicap may enter any competitions that their category of membership entitles them to, provided the competition fee is paid before play commences.
2. All players are required to book tee times directly with the Sports Hub, and on the day of the relevant competition must report to the Sports Hub at least 15 minutes prior to the designated tee off time.

If a player is not able to play on the day or does not arrive on time, they must ring the Sports Hub and cancel their booking as soon as possible. This is also considered to be common courtesy to your fellow member playing partners.

3. Sports Hub staff are responsible for managing the tee times for the competition of the day.
4. Players must start at their designated tee time or, in any major events, at the tee time/s as laid down by the Match Committee.
5. The following handicap grades apply to club competitions,

More than 60 players:-	Less than 60 players:-
A Grade – scratch to 8.3 GA	A Grade – scratch to 11.9 GA
B Grade – 8.4 to 15.7 GA	B Grade – 12 and above
C Grade – 15.8 GA and above	

“Other than any designated grading changes for Club Championships”.

6. All signed scorecards must be returned to the Sports Hub within 30 minutes of the completion of the round.
 7. Cards not signed by both the player and marker and lodged within 30 minutes of completion of their round of golf will render the competitor possible for disqualification.
 8. Members and their guests, in entering club competitions, acknowledge and consent that their names may appear on club notice boards, prize value listings and in media outlets should they be successful in winning any prizes or events in that competition.
- **Local rules**
Refer to the scorecard and notice boards in and or near the Sports Hub for any local rules.
 - **Golf carts**
Please refer to pages 8 and 9 regarding the use of golf carts on the golf course.
With regards to the use of golf carts in competitions, they are permitted during all events noted in the syllabus.

- **Ties in competitions**
In all 18 hole competitions where a tie occurs, the tie shall be resolved by using the countback method; except in monthly medals; match play competitions, club championships, foursomes and mixed foursome events. (See the respective wording under each event further in the syllabus).
- **Competition winnings**
The entry fee for all competitions is determined by the Match Committee and can be amended from time to time as deemed appropriate and necessary. Prize voucher allocation is determined by the Match Committee and managed for and on behalf of the Golf Club by the Sports Hub staff using guidelines provided by the Match Committee.
Aggregate totals of prize vouchers for all relevant allocations (eg; winners; runners up; ntps, etc...) is recorded on a list maintained by the Sports Hub staff.
These funds can then be redeemed for various purchases of goods or services which may be amended from time to time as determined by the Golf Club Management Committee.
- **Jackpot pin**
Aside from the various prize allocations for each daily competition, there is also a ‘weekly jackpot pin’ which is currently the 9th hole.
This jackpot pin is only open to all financial members in all Golf Club playing categories.
To be eligible, the player must enter the jackpot pin by paying \$1, on top of their daily competition fee, prior to play commencing on that day.
The aggregate total of \$1 entry fees across the whole week is then allocated to the winner of the closest to the pin on the 9th hole, following closure of competition play on each given Sunday.

Major Competition Events

Men's Club Championship

Restricted to financial 7 day members who have submitted at least 10 cards in Golf Club competitions within the preceding 12 months and the following rules and regulations apply:

1. A member must not be deemed to be in arrears with fees or levies due to the Golf Club or Hidden Valley Resort.
2. In all grades, a member must have returned at least 10 single entry competition cards at Hidden Valley during the twelve months immediately preceding the championship.
3. The following grades will apply based on daily handicaps: A Grade 0-9; B Grade 10-18; C Grade 19+
4. The grade that a player competes in will be determined by their handicap on the first day of the club championships and will be fixed for all 4 rounds.
5. The entry fee must be paid **prior** to tee-off in the first round.
6. The Championship will be determined over 72 holes of gross stroke play. After 36 holes, the leading 8 players in each grade will be seeded to play together at tee-off times to be determined by the Match Committee.
7. There will be a concurrent nett competition played over 72 holes, with winners determined by the overall nett aggregate score in each grade.
8. A, B and C Grade players will play off the Black tees,
9. Motorised carts are allowed to be used by players in all grades.
10. In the event of a tie in any grade, relating to the 'gross' score, there will be a play off, initially over holes 1,2, 6, then 9. If, after the play off a tie is still

the situation, then hole 9 will be played repetitively until a winner is determined.

11. In the event of a tie in any grade, relating to the nett score, then the result will be determined by countback pertaining to the last round of the Championships.

Womens Club Championship

Restricted to financial 7 & 6 day members who have submitted at least 10 cards in Golf Club competitions within the preceding 12 months and the following rules and regulations apply:

1. A member must not be deemed to be in arrears with fees or levies due to the Golf Club or Hidden Valley Resort.
2. A member must have returned at least 10 single entry competition cards in Golf Club competitions during the 12 months immediately preceding the Championship.
3. One grade will apply, played off the red tees,
4. The entry fee must be paid **prior** to tee-off in the first round.
5. The Championship will be determined over 72 holes of gross stroke play. After 36 holes, the leading 8 players will be seeded to play together at tee-off times to be determined by the Match Committee.
6. There will be a concurrent nett competition played over 72 holes, with winners determined by the overall nett aggregate score.
7. Motorised carts are allowed to be used by all players.
8. In the event of a tie in relating to the 'gross' score, then there will be a play off, initially over holes 1,2, 6, then 9. If, after the play- off, a tie is still the situation, then hole 9 will be played repetitively until a winner is determined.

9. In the event of a tie relating to the nett score, then the result will be determined by countback pertaining to the last round of the championships.

Veterans Club Championship

Restricted to financial 7 day members (men) 6 and 7 day members women who have attained the age of 60, prior to the commencement of the first round of this event. who have submitted at least 10 cards in Golf Club competitions within the preceding 12 months and the following rules and regulations apply:

1. A member must not be deemed to be in arrears with fees or levies due to the Golf Club.
2. One grade will apply, played off the white tees for men and gold tees for Ladies'.
3. The entry fee must be paid **prior** to tee-off in the first round.
4. The Championship will be determined over 72 holes of gross stroke play. After 36 holes, the leading 8 players will be seeded to play together at tee-off times to be determined by the Match Committee.
5. There will be a concurrent nett competition played over 72 holes, with winners determined by the overall nett aggregate score.
6. Motorised carts are allowed to be used by all players.
7. In the event of a tie in relating to the 'gross' score, then there will be a play off, initially over holes 1,2, 6, then 9. If, after the play-off, a tie is still the situation, then hole 9 will be played repetitively until a winner is determined.

Junior Championship

The event is eligible for all financial junior members who are 18 years of age or under, on commencement of the first round. This is a stroke event to be held over 36 holes, over 2 consecutive Sundays as per the syllabus. Boys will play off white tees and girls off the red tees.

In the event of a tie in relation to the 'gross' score, there will be a play off, initially over holes 1,2, 6, then 9. If, after the play-off, a tie is still the situation, then hole 9 will be played repetitively until a winner is determined. Match Committee may implement special conditions to increase participation. Any such conditions will be communicated prior to the commencement of the first round.

Men's Singles Open Match Play Knock Out (SMPKO)

This event is open to all financial 7 day male Golf Club members. Match play to be played as a stroke event, off the white tees and using the match index (not the Stroke Index).

Entry fee must be paid **prior** to the start of the qualifying round. In the event of a tie, players will continue their match as a sudden death playoff and the winner determined as the person to win the first clear hole, commencing from hole 1, again using their handicap in accordance with the Match Index.

Women's Singles Open Match Play Knock Out (WSMPKO)

This event is open to all financial 7 day female Golf Club members. Match play to be played as a stroke event, using the Match Index (not the Stroke Index).

In the event of a tie, players will continue their match as a sudden death playoff and the winner determined as the person to win the first clear hole, commencing from hole 1, again using their handicap in accordance with the Match Index.

Men's Monthly Medal

The event will be open to financial 7 day male Golf Club members.

The winner is the player with the best nett score for the day (all grades).

If there is a tie on the day, the players with the tied score will play-off for the current month's medal (eg: April) in the following month (i.e. May) as well as playing for the monthly medal of that current month (i.e. May). The winner of the previously tied monthly medal will be the person with the best nett score and will be calculated based on the handicap they were playing off when they initially tied.

Womens' Monthly Medal

The event will be open to financial 7 day Golf Club female members.

The winner is the player with the best nett score for the day (all grades).

If there is a tie on the day, the players with the tied score will play-off for the current month's medal (eg: April) in the following month (ie May) as well as playing for the monthly medal of that current month (ie: May). The winner of the previously tied monthly medal will be the person with the best nett score and will be calculated based on the handicap they were playing off when they initially tied.

Medal of Medallists (Men's & Womens')

The event will be open to financial Golf Club members of who have won a monthly medal during the current year.

The event is to be played using current daily handicaps as of the date of the event.

The winner is the player with the best nett score for the day.

Players will be grouped together on the designated date of the event, at times to be determined by the Match Committee and in the event of a tie, the winner will be determined by the countback method.

Eclectic Competition

The event will be open to financial Golf Club members and is to be held in conjunction with Monthly Medal events.

There will be two grades open for this event being "A" grade for players with daily handicaps of 13 or less and "B" grade for players with daily handicaps of 14 and above.

A player's daily handicap as at the commencement of their first monthly medal round competition determines their grade for the whole year.

At the conclusion of the first round the player's score for each hole is counted as their best score for that hole. That best score continues to count until the player records a lower score on that hole which then replaces the previous score.

The winner in each grade is determined after the final monthly medal round by tallying the scores for each hole. The winner is the person with the lowest overall score in each grade.

There is no requirement to play a minimum number of

monthly medal rounds. e.g. If only one Monthly Medal round is played, then that is the overall final score.

Prior to the commencement of the 2nd Monthly Medal round and then onwards, a Leader's Board will be available on the Sports Hub's noticeboard for participants to check their progress and position. In addition, sheets showing an individual's hole-by-hole position will be available for viewing prior to each round in the Sports Hub.

Men's and Womens' Foursomes Championship (separate events)

These events will be open to financial Golf Club male and female 7 day members only. To be held over 36 holes on a designated Saturday as per the syllabus. The winners are the team with the best gross total for the 36 holes.

Foursomes is played by hitting alternate shots until the ball is holed. Player A hits off the odd holes in the first round and then the even holes in the second round.

In the event of a tie there will be a sudden death play-off commencing from the first hole.

Mixed Foursomes Championship

The event will be open to financial 6 & 7 day members of the Golf Club only. Each team must contain a male and a female member.

To be held over 36 holes on a designated Sunday as per the syllabus. The winners are the team with the best gross total for the 36 holes.

Foursomes is played by hitting alternate shots until the ball is holed. Player A hits off the odd holes in the first round and then the even holes in the second round.

In the event of a tie there will be a sudden death play-off commencing from the first hole.

4BBB Match Play Knock Out (4BBBMPKO)

The event will be open to all financial 6 & 7 day members of the Golf Club only. Match play is to be played from the stroke index as Stableford. The team with the best stableford score on the hole wins.

The leading 8 pairs from a 4BBB Stableford qualifying event, progress to the match play knockout.

Draw to be completed for all initial matches and will be played on Sundays.

In the event of a tie after 18 holes, there will be sudden death play-off commencing from the first hole.

Hidden Valley Shield

The event will be open to financial 6 & 7 day members of the Golf Club only. The event is held over three Sundays as per the syllabus. This is a stroke event. The winner is the player with the best aggregate nett score for the 3 rounds (all grades), played using the daily handicap used in the first round of this event.

Ties will be determined by countback.

Autumn Cup

The event will be open to all members of the Golf Club. The event is a PAR handicap event held over 2 rounds in March. Ties will be determined by countback.

Winter Cup

The event will be open to all members of the Golf Club. The event is a Stableford handicap event held over 2 rounds in June. Ties will be determined by countback.

Summer Cup

The event will be open to all members of the Golf Club. The event is a stroke handicap event held over 2 rounds in December. Ties will be determined by countback.

Seniors' Championship

The event will be open to financial 6 & 7 day Golf Club members only, who have attained the age of 55, prior to the commencement of the first round of this event.

This is a stableford event and will be played over designated rounds with the player with the highest aggregate stableford score over the full 4 rounds, being the winner.

Handicap of the day to be used in each round. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by using the countback method on the scores achieved in the final round.

Stableford Championship

The event will be open to financial 7 day Golf Club members only.

There will be five Stableford competition days nominated in the syllabus as Round 1, Round 2 etc. of the Stableford Championship.

The player's Stableford score for the day constitutes their score for that completed round.

The champion will be the player who has the highest accumulated stableford points total from their **best three** completed rounds out of the five designated rounds.

There is no requirement to play a minimum number of qualifying rounds e.g. if only three rounds are played by a player, then those are the rounds that are counted.

Prior to the commencement of Round 2 of this event, a Leader's Board will be available on the Sports Hub noticeboard for participants to check their progressive score and position.

In the event of a tie, there will be joint winners.

Par Championship

The event will be open to financial 7 day Golf Club members only.

There will be five Par competition days nominated in the syllabus as Round 1, Round 2 etc. of the Par Championship.

The players Par score for the day constitutes their score for that completed round.

The champion will be the player who has the highest accumulated Par total from their **best three** completed rounds out of the five designated rounds.

There is no requirement to play a minimum number of qualifying rounds e.g. if only three rounds are played by a player, then those are the rounds that are counted.

Prior to the commencement of Round 2 of this event, a Leaders Board will be available on the clubs noticeboard for participants to check their progressive score and position. In the event of a tie, there will be joint winners.

Ladies' Captain's Cup

The event will be open to ALL financial female members of the Golf Club only. This event will be held on the last Tuesday of each month as a Stableford event.

Seniors' Friday Competitions

The events will be open to any player, who have attained the age of 55, this is a Stableford event and all players may chose the tee colour they wish to play off.
